



The Bushwich Trunk Line is a proposal for a massive new subway through northern Brooklyn. The subway begins under the East River where two tracks from the 6th Ave line meet up with two tracks from the 8th Ave line. There is a four track express station at Berry and South 4th streets which continues east to connect with two tracks off the Williamsburg Bridge. Here the tracks merge into six tracks with a two track local station. At Union Ave all trains stop at a massive six track, four platform station which was partially constructed in the 1930s and connects to the Crosstown line. From Union Ave to Beaver Street, a new street though Williamsburg will be cut, under which will run two local tracks and four express tracks below that, with two local stations at Manhattan Ave and Flushing Ave. Right before the Myrtle Ave station a forth set of tracks enters in from a new branch off the Canarsie line. At Myrtle Ave will be a massive eight track, four platform station to sort commuters coming from Flatbush, Forest Hills, Jamaica, Bushwick, Crown Heights, Sheepshead Bay, and Williamsburg. When the different lines leave the station they do so in three, four track trunk lines each with express and local service.
